Black-throated Blue Warbler [Setophaga caerulescens]

Special Aspects

Sea ducks were generally few in number, particularly those species that tend to stay offshore and don't enter bays/ivers (e.g., Northern Gannet). This was likely due to the fog in the morning hours, which greatly limited offshore visibility.

First-ever included Black-throated Blue Warbler observed.

All-time high numbers observed for Bald Eagle, Clapper Rail, Yellow-bellied Sapsucker, Downy Woodpecker, Blue-headed Vireo, White-breasted and Brown-headed Nuthatches, Eastern Bluebird, and Black-and-white Warbler.

Numbers observed of Brown Thrasher and Orange-crowned Warbler tied all-time high records.

Birds not observed that are normally present: Northern Gannet, Fox Sparrow.
