Feeding the Birds By Teta Kain

If you are trying to attract birds to your backyard, you won't want to miss Teta Kain's presentation "Feeding the Birds." Teta will discuss different types of feed to use and what birds are attracted to each. She'll show you different types of feeders and which ones work the best. She'll mention special tricks that not only help to attract a greater variety of birds year round but also how to help keep the birds safe from predators as they feed. Mixed in with all of this are some of Teta's funny and unusual moments she's experienced trying to photograph birds in their natural and unnatural habits.

Teta has been a wildlife photographer for over 40 years, and has traveled extensively, photographing everything from bugs to birds. Since she and her husband arrived in Virginia in 1978, Teta has been involved with many nature and environmental organizations. She was president of the Hampton Roads Bird Club in the late 1980s, and was compiler of the Newport News Christmas bird count in the early 1990s. Over a 27-year period she served on the board of the Virginia Society of Ornithology as president, secretary, chairman of the state bird records committee (VARCOM), and editor of the state's bird journal, *The Raven*. She received the Society's Myriam P. Moore award for outstanding service in 2008.

What to Do If You Find an Injured/Orphaned Wild Bird By Susan Morris

The program will give guidelines for what to do when one finds an injured, orphaned or otherwise in-need - of - human - intervention wild bird, from hatchlings to adults, with some brief suggestions on dealing with State and Federal authorities whose job it is to protect wild birds, torture rehabbers, and terrify good Samaritans.

Susan has been a wildlife rehabilitator for about 15 years, with a Federal license for rehabbing wild birds. She created and began the family mediation program in Portsmouth Juvenile Court, where she combined family mediation with rehabbing and retired some three years ago from her private business. Susan along with her husband Lee are members of HRBC.

Field Trip to Craney Island Wednesday, 10:30 AM, Sept. 5, 2018

Jason Strickland has arranged a September 5 field trip to Craney Island in Portsmouth. Craney is a restricted area with very, very limited access, just across the M & M tunnel. We are limited to 25 members only and will need to carpool. If you are interested, please email me as soon as possible. The first 25 will be added to a list; then a waiting list will be started.

Shore birds are in the middle of their fall migration, and there is nowhere else in Virginia to observe them like the odd moonscape of Craney Island. The chance to see life birds is high. We will see shore birds in the thousands, along with waders and various songbirds. Some waterfowl may be around, but it is a bit early for ducks. Be warned, however, that Craney is loaded with mosquitoes. We'll drive to a few sites in the restricted area and hike little, but the short slopes providing access to the best views can be fairly steep.

We will meet at the Hampton Bass Pro, in the south eastern parking lot at 10:30 AM Wednesday and leave by 10:45 AM. If you are meeting us at Craney Island, you need to be at the gate by 11:15 AM. 
With some effort, a search of the deep state (aka the various Boards of York County) uncorked the location of Peterman. VEEP Pete was then birding in Alaska, but also lining up presenters for the club meetings for September through May of 2018-19, while remotely encouraging Dianne and Jane to wrangle an organizing committee for the 2018 Annual Picnic. All busy, the whole lot of 'em.

And the rest of us appreciated the results – a good time with good food on June 9. Jason had led off at

This excursion began with the formation at 6:00 AM of a convoy in Newport News Park. The Reedy Creek Trail parking lot on the south bank of the James in Richmond was nearly jammed on arrival. Temperature and dew point were initially in the high 60s, while cloudiness was variable with light winds from the west and south all morning. Jason Strickland led Jane Frigo, Harry and Rochelle Colestock, Phyllis Roth, Lisa Rose, Stuart Sweetman, Matt Betts, Dianne Snyder, Ellis Maxey, Joe and Mary Clarke, Tom Charlock and Don Brunk upstream on a warbler hunt

While few songbirds could be sighted in the dense vegetation, those with experienced ears were more pleased. Near the elevated pedestrian railroad crossover at the 42nd Street parking lot, Stuart spotted a Swainson's Warbler, and Jane saw a Scarlet Tanager. Tulip poplars were in bloom, about which Blackpoll Warbler, Northern Parula, and Downy Woodpecker were seen.

By 10:00 AM, we were back at the cars for a refreshing light meal. It had warmed to 80 degrees. Over 50 species were then on the list. Heading toward Belle Isle on the Buttermilk Trail, Jason spotted a Magnolia Warbler among a cluster of berries. A light breeze provided some relief as we hiked on the wood-paved footbridge high over the wet boulders. There we saw Cliff Swallows (but fewer were nesting than last year), Osprey, Canada Geese and a few Great Blues at distance.

Near midday at Belle Isle itself, the intermittent direct sun and a temperature in the high 80s proved a scorcher. The gang fragmented. Lisa pointed out a hawk in a large clump of low vegetation under the Lee Bridge; Stuart identified it as a juvenile Red Tailed. It was a good day overall for birding, but the birders had not yet acquired their sea legs for the summer heat.
